In a school setting, Bullying is a commonly used word to describe a variety of mean behavior.

Bullying is defined as:

- The repeated actions or threats of action directed toward a person by one or more people
- A power imbalance
- Intention to cause harm



It is important to distinguish bullying from other unkind, mean or harmful behavior. Calling someone a name or pushing someone once, being rude or having an argument with someone is not bullying.




#### **RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY NOVEMBER 14TH**

Six-year-old Ruby Bridges stepped into the history books in 1960 when she integrated William Frantz Elementary School in New Orleans, becoming a national icon for the civil rights movement. Ruby is alive today and 69 years old.

Today her story continues to inspire the next generation of leaders to end racism together—One step at a time.

On Tuesday, November 14, 2023, all of HDMS will be gathering in the school parking lot at 10:00 AM. We will walk around the block from Fantastic Drive to Cannan Street to Silverada Blvd. We will be wearing purple and we have flags and banners to bring awareness to Ruby Bridges' contribution to civil rights and the relative recency of desegregation of schools.

The students at Rita Cannan Elementary will be joining us on the walk!
