

What are the Great Lessons?



The Great Lessons are exciting, engaging stories given to Elementary students. The purpose of the Great Lessons are to designed to spark students' imagination and curiosity. The Great Lessons are usually given to students in the first few .months of school.

There are 5 Great Lessons

The First Great Lesson: The Creation of the Universe.

The Second Great Lesson: The Coming of Life.

The Third Great Lesson: The Story of Humans.

The Fourth Great Lesson: The Story of Communication.

The Fifth Great Lesson: The Story of Numbers.

CODE RED

Wednesday, HDMS conducted a "Code Red" drill. This is a drill where we simulate a security threat inside the building. Teachers discussed the process with their children in developmentally appropriate terms before the drill. The process starts with me announcing the drill over our public address system. Teachers lock their doors, turn off the lights, and children sit quietly in a corner until the drill is completed while teachers report their attendance. The entire process took 7 minutes and 5 seconds and went very smoothly.

State Law requires us to hold one fire drill per month, two "Code Red" drills, two "Code Yellow" drills, and one earthquake drill per year. A "Code Yellow" is a security threat in the neighborhood or some event that requires children and classes to stay in rooms with doors locked. This could even be used in a medical emergency where we just need space. All training and guidance on drills are facilitated through the help of the Washoe County School District's Office of Emergency Management.

Our number one priority in all situations is to ensure the safety of our students, staff, and volunteers. Thank you for supporting us in these efforts.

ILLNESS SCREENING TOOL

As the weather gets colder, and we all spend more time inside, cold and flu season is upon us again. Please refer to our Daily Illness Screening Tool if you have any questions about your child's attendance at school due to illness.



Illness Screening Tool

If you are not feeling well, stay home and seek care as needed.

If you have questions, contact your school nurse or healthcare provider. To report an absence, call your school or use the Infinite Campus Absence Request tool.

If you have any new or unusual symptoms of illness...

- Do NOT go to school/work.
- Communicate with your school/supervisor. Parents may contact the school with exclusion-related questions.
- Seek care from your healthcare provider, if needed.
- If you experience any new symptoms, check this tool.



and follow instructions below for specific signs and symptoms. One or more of the following: STAY at home until you have been free of fever, vomiting, and diarrhea for 24 hours without the use of symptom-reducing medication. Fever (temperature ≥100.4°F at rest) Vomiting (The 24 hour time period may be extended if illnesses are spreading in a Diarrhea classroom or school. Such information will be communicated to families.) Rash has resolved -or-Undiagnosed skin rash Healthcare provider statement indicates that the rash is not contagious. Yellow or greenish drainage Drainage has resolved -orfrom eyes, nose, or ears Provide proof of antibiotic treatment for prior 24 hours. ISOLATE at home until all 3 conditions are met: (1) 5 days have passed since symptoms began, (2) No fever/diarrhea/vomiting in last 24 hrs without medicine, and (3) Other symptoms are improving. Positive for COVID-19 test Eligible to return on day 6, if 3 conditions above are met. (home or laboratory test) Wear fitted mask around others for next 5 days. If you are not able or willing to wear a well-fitting mask, remain isolated at home for 10 days. You may return on day 11, if symptomatic conditions above are met. For moderate (difficulty breathing) or severe illness (hospitalization), talk with healthcare provider and consider isolating through day 10.

Sore throat

Mildly ill and unable to participate in normal school activities.

As long as you do not experience symptoms listed above, return when symptoms have improved.

We hope you feel better soon and look forward to seeing you in class.

Eat well. Sleep. Wash your hands.

RUBY BRIDGES WALK TO SCHOOL DAY NOVEMBER 14TH

Six-year-old Ruby Bridges stepped into the history books in 1960 when she integrated William Frantz Elementary School in New Orleans, becoming a national icon for the civil rights movement. Ruby is alive today and 69 years old.

Today her story continues to inspire the next generation of leaders to end racism together— One step at a time.

On Tuesday, November 14, 2023, all of HDMS will be gathering in the school parking lot at 10:00 AM. We will walk around the block from Fantastic Drive to Cannan Street to Silverada Blvd. We will be wearing purple and we have flags and banners to bring awareness to Ruby Bridges' contribution to civil rights and the relative recency of desegregation of schools.


The students at Rita Cannan Elementary will be joining us on the walk!



DONATIONS NEEDED!



NOTES FROM THE GREEN PARENTS



Did you ever think about how aluminium is recycled? You probably treat BEVERAGE CANS just like anybody else, crushing them to the smallest possible, for fun and to reduce their volume in your trash bin. But think twice! Here in Nevada, we have single-stream recycling where all materials end up in the same blue bin and get sorted at a facility. Sounds easy enough, but it is not. Crushed aluminium cans do not have a clear shape, and therefore the sorting machine will probably not recognize them (EPA). So, all your efforts of reducing volume and separating will still dump cans into landfill. Which means: NO MORE CRUSHING CANS! Give cans a chance so they can ride the recycling-merry-go-round indefinitely!


🌞MARIA MONTESSORI WAS A JEDI 🌟

ELEMENTARY LEVEL

RUBY CLASSROOM

Social Studies theme: What can we do to help our community? This week we begin our plans for a school bake sale to raise money for the animal shelter.

Science Theme: We are doing experiments on improving growth of plants and exploring the things necessary to grow.

Math: In addition to the lesson work, students should be working on addition, subtraction, multiplication or division at school everyday.

1st Grade: We are learning prefixes for the geometry shapes.

2nd Grade: We are exploring the different parts of a triangle.

3rd Grade: We are learning about the area and perimeter of irregular shapes by using Lego.

Reading: In addition to reading at home, we should be reading at school everyday(there are some children that are confused about this).

Early Readers: We are reading "Pigs Aplenty, Pigs Galore", "From Anne to Zack", and "Sometimes" and practicing sight words.

Developing Readers: Students will use magnetic letters and create a story using nouns, verbs and adjectives.

Effective Readers: Students will use a literature circle to encourage annotation of important ideas.


Montessori through My Eyes
