What is Autonomy?

Autonomy is the ability to have control over one's own actions.

There are 3 types of Autonomy-Intellectual, Physical/Behavioral and Emotional.

Intellectual autonomy is being able to think for oneself- using metacognition (thinking about thinking).

Physical/behavioral autonomy is a willingness and ability to be independent; knowing and following behavioral expectations.



Emotional autonomy is the ability to feel for one's self. Emotionally autonomous individuals learn to be aware of others, are empathetic, employ active listening and are aware of physical boundaries and body language as a means of communication.

Montessori classrooms foster autonomy which helps to create children who are confident learners, are independent and intrinsically motivated, and are self-aware but also aware of the world around them.



HDMS is looking to improve our library. Over the last few years, our teaching staff focused on evaluating our teaching practices. Upon reflection, our school library needs an infusion of books written in the 21st century.



By funding this project you will allow birthday students to select a book that best represents them, their culture, or their passions and help us fill the remodeled library funded by the school last year. Inclusive literature provides "mirrors, windows, and sliding glass doors" that allow students to see themselves portrayed, allow them to see identities different from theirs, and allow students to enter into a new world of understanding of and empathy for others (Bishop, 2015). When students are proud of who they are and connected to the school, they are engaged and interested in learning. Students present on cultural studies which is linked to improved attendance and test scores. In addition to the Social emotional benefits, our teachers using these books are empowered to implement the culturally responsive strategies. These strategies are proven to increase reading comprehension and mathematical thinking and in a New America article, a group of students were motivated to make changes in their local community.

STEAM / CODING CREATIVE EXPRESSION CLASS








FAMILY STEAM NIGHT!
