What are Constructive Triangles?

The Constructive Triangle boxes are found in Primary and Elementary classrooms. At the Primary level, the Constructive Triangles are sensorial materials. In Elementary, they are a geometry material. The Constructive Triangles are a set of 5-6 boxes that contain different types of triangles that introduce children to different types of shapes. The boxes also help children learn that all plane geometric shapes can be constructed from triangles.





PE CREATIVE EXPRESSION CLASS


Creative Expression Class PE played Field Hokey in the community center. We had so much fun!


