

1. Montessori is just for rich kids

Many Montessori schools are private schools, however, Montessori public education began in the 1970's to help address desegregation. Now there are over 500 publicly funded Montessori schools in the United States.

2. In Montessori classrooms, children run around and do whatever they want.

The Montessori method provides children with freedom of choice of purposeful activity The children are involved with self selected work designed to build concentration and independence

3. The Montessori method is against fantasy, therefore stifling creativity.

Dr, Montessori found that children preferred practical activities that fulfilled their inner needs. Montessori classrooms allow for safe expression through art, music, movement and manipulation of materials

4. Montessori is outdated.

Changes have been made to the original Montessori curriculum, such as introducing computers, and modifications to Practical Life exercises to keep them culturally relevant. However the child guided approach has not changed since Dr. Montessori's lifetime. Research confirms Montessori's insights.

NEVADA READY GRANT FOR 3-YEAR OLDS & 4-YEAR OLDS

High Desert Montessori School was approved participate the in Nevada Ready Grant, sponsored by the United Way again this school year. This grant allows for qualifying 3 and 4-year-olds to attend our Primary program's school day program at no cost.

This school year, we were fortunate enough to qualify 16 children for this grant. Our hope is to qualify 16 3 and 4-year-old children for the 24-25 school year. The eligibility requirements of the grant are that children enrolled in the program must be 4 years old by the cutoff date and families determined to be income eligible below 200% of poverty level. More information can be found HERE.



For the 2023-2024 school year, families must meet 2 eligibility requirements:

- 1. Children must be at least 4 years of age on or before August 1, 2023.
- 2. The family's annual household income must be at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL).*


NOTES FROM THE GREEN PARENTS GROUP

Students present on cultural studies which is linked to improved attendance and test scores. These strategies are proven to increase reading comprehension and mathematical thinking and in a New America article, a group of students were motivated to make changes in their local community.
